

of the Education Committee to find out how to explain that 900 page bill in 15 minutes, and I think she could do it. It might have to be prioritized if it is important, but we just don't take any bill that's really not of major consequence and special order it because it is of no more importance than any other senators' bills that we have out there we'd like to do. But, yet, here it is before us. The point I would like to make is this. I am going to withdraw the motion, but, members of the Legislature, please note by this, we've got five special order bills, one of them is not important or a crisis. Let me rephrase that, it is important to reorganize the statutes, but it changes nothing; it makes no major change. We don't have to do it now, yet it has been special ordered. The Speaker has the power now to take any bill he wants and special order it, whether it's important or not. The only thing that we're doing on the rules is saying that you can take this power and also do amendments and motions. But please note, members of the Legislature, this is not an important bill, is of a crisis. It will be a nice bill. and Senator Bohlke's LB 900 should, for the most part, face the same consequences that any other of our bills do, and that is in a short session, you do what's necessary to try to get your bills passed. Senator Bohlke says that we might have to reprint the bill. That's assuming that it's not talked about in its regular order. If it's that important, we want to save costs, we can prioritize the bill. We can have it, you know, at some point on consent calendar since it's not controversial. It can be done. This is not the best way to do it, and it's part of the difficulty is when we have a special order. So I don't agree with 900 being on the list. It shouldn't be on the list. I am not going to vote against it, and I'm not going to put the Legislature through an ordeal of debating whether it should be or not. The Speaker has chosen it to be put on it. And, as the Speaker knows, even though I am arguing against his decision on this one, I will still be on my hands and knees begging that sometime he will take one of my bills as a consent calendar bill, but we will fight that battle when it gets there. So at this point, I withdraw the motion.
