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confines of the Clerk's Office and the way these things are handled. We had some discussion and the concept of that arbitrary number, that if it is less than ten, it will be printed in the Journal. If it is more than ten, it will not be printed in the Journal was they thought it might hamper their ability to deal with, as an example I believe, the amendment comes in at four-thirty in the afternoon, and it is ten and a half pages long, it would, in fact, simpler in that case to actually print it in the Journal as opposed to printing it separately. So what this amendment would do, it would say that all amendments which are approximately ten pages or more shall be noted in the daily Journal as on file in the Bill Room or the Clerk's Office. As I understand this rule is that the requirement that the rule would still be...that the amendment would be alternatively, and there is Senator Chambers, who I will yield the rest of the time to, if he might want to add to this, that amendments that were not printed separately would, in fact, be in the Journal. But this just does away with that specific bright line of ten pages by adding the word "approximately", at least that's my recollection. You will now hear the true story of what this amendment does. If Senator Chambers would like to enlighten us more, I would yield the rest of my time to him.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President and members of the Legislature, what this amendment really will do, it strikes all of the proposals that we adopted in the last few days and we will be back where we started. I just wanted to see if anybody was listening. Senator Withem explained it very well, and there is no need of me prolonging the discussion. I support the amendment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Bromm.

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you. Thank you, Madam President. I just rise briefly, I think the Chairman of the Rules Committee, Senator Will, could not be here this morning and he and I spoke late yesterday afternoon about this amendment, and the others that are pending, and Senator Will, on behalf of the Rules Committee, I know would strongly support this amendment and just urge the body to adopt it. I think it is a good clean-up provision which adds a little bit of flexibility, which we
