And I have to stand here and tell you that I certainly hold no malice toward anyone. And I understand Senator Chambers' feelings and I guess I understand some of the women's feelings. I did have some calls from some people who were very upset and I can understand why they were. But I just wanted to give you my version of what happened and hope that for the betterment of this body and the country as a whole it doesn't happen again. With that, thank you.
