

something into a hard and fast rule here and we create a bureaucracy, they're much less flexible than someone who, like a judge who is listening to each and every case. We're saying this must be done if this occurs. So we're not knowing what is occurring and saying if it does occur you have to have this happen. You lose your opportunity for flexibility. You lose your opportunity to be involved in each individual case. And these are individual cases involving each individual family, and they have gotten very complicated. I have had more phone calls since I was elected on these issues than any other issue. And I have people coming to me with problems paying for support. People coming to me with a no-fault divorce, with problems with the no-fault divorce. We need to take a look at these issues and really make some, some changes. But I'm not sure, that here we're looking at just the, or the issue of nonpayment of child support and we're creating 592, which is, I think, too much to handle what we're looking at. I think my amendment offers a simple solution that should at least be tried. It's a simpler process that should at least be tried to see how effective that is before we fall into, as other states have fallen into, you know I have people telling me that, you know, they'll have problems with, with the records, they'll have, you know, all these different problems if we throw this into the bureaucracy. I would rather keep it into the court system that it's in right now and allow, as in my amendment, to say that, that those will be the individuals making the decision. It just says that we, the Legislature does declare that there's a potential of, of impoundment of motor vehicle operator's license for failure to pay child, spousal, and medical support is an effective technique. We have found in other states that it is an effective technique, particularly for nonwage earners and self-employed license holders who are not in compliance with these orders. And it's the intent of the Legislature to encourage the use of proven techniques, to encourage such license holders to comply with their legal obligations and to add tools available for the enforcement of support and visitation orders. So it addresses both those issues. And it finds that the Department of Social Services communicate to individuals, who are not in compliance, that the potential for impoundment of their motor vehicle license is there. So they will be notifying people that they, there is a chance that when they're going into the court situation, and in some cases probably a very good chance, that their license will be revoked.
