PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Brown.

SENATOR BROWN: Madam President, members of the body, I attended a Midwest CSG Conference this summer. And in the preconference information that was sent out there were surveys about some of the hot topics that had dominated many of the legislatures that were involved. And in the survey about license revocation, Nebraska was the only state in the Midwest region that had not passed some sort of license revocation legislation. Many of them had passed that legislation very recently. And if you look at the list of states that Senator Beutler...the information from U.S. News & World Report, you'll note that seven of the states in the Midwest region are above Nebraska in terms of the percentage of child support collections they are receiving. And they're...and seven of them are above half. The three that are below us are three that...that had just recently passed their legislation. So it appears to me that it's very significant in increasing the collection of child support. And if you look at the top two states are Midwest CSG states, Minnesota and Wisconsin. But the other thing that was interesting about it is that even in those states which are significantly higher than other parts of the nation in terms of child support collection, they're still less than 40 percent. Minnesota is at 36.5, Wisconsin is at 36.9, so that we know that there are over half of the children that are still not being supported. And we are having a lot of discussion in this, but we're not talking a lot, except for Senator Preister and others, about the children and whether they are being taken care of. Senator Beutler, I wondered if you know how many states have license revocation statutes?

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator, the latest information I have, which is compiled by the Department of Health and Human Services, the federal department shows 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, at least 19 states have it now, 3 more...4 more are in the process of considering it at least, and this is a year old.
