SPEAKER WITHEM: One minute.

SENATOR HILLMAN: ...just specifically the figures for the license revocation might be more difficult as time goes on because it all blends in with all those services as far as just total collection of child support, not just necessarily...

SENATOR WITEK: Well, we could...

SENATOR HILLMAN: ...that, so I'm just not too sure how I'm going to vote on this. I think if we want to get the kinds of costs that we want, we can get on Appropriations Committee at any one time, if you want to look at how you're going to compile all of these and how you're going to pull them out, I think you want to give a second thought to really what you are creating here and what it would cause the different agencies over a period of time, and not just at first, but over a period of time, and looking at how you could develop some type of sense to have the data collection that might be required. Thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Hillman. Senator Witek, there are no other lights on. You're recognized to close.

SENATOR WITEK: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the body. Part of my point in introducing the amendment, and I would like to get to a vote on it, I had intended maybe to amend it to make sure that we get the specific costs of any increase in support payments. But part of my point in introducing this amendment was to illustrate that it is a very bureaucratic approach. It will be affecting a lot of different areas. And maybe we can request that the...this data says at this point payments are being made at the rate of 20.3 percent, so that any increase in that payment and the cost to administer that increase. My point is that what we do is pass a law based on the fact that we want to increase the collection of child support. I assume that's what you're wanting to do is to increase the collection of child support. You're not doing it to hurt families, you're not doing it to pull professional licenses or any kind of license. You're doing it to increase the payment of child support, so that those individuals who are supposed to be paying child support will begin to pay more...their child support, and those families that are relying on some of the state programs to fill that gap
