It is ironic, I have had two cases since last night about errors made in government brought to my attention, one more serious than the other, but the one this morning talked about, a call said, they have had three errors on someone with having...being current on their child support but have had three notices of failure to pay, and it takes so long to get it straightened out. And, that is my problem with many of these that even when an error is made, it takes so long to work through the system. Another one I have that I won't go into, but it never should happen, concerning a drivers license, this person has worked three weeks now to attempt to take a license and all she has run into is stonewalling, and that is the kind of the thing that bothers me about government. This type of amendment then, on the other side of that, giving a cause of action. Even though I feel badly about those that are hurt in this case, we simply cannot open up government to this kind of thing. It seems like to me that it will take forever to recover. I think it would be better if we would look at these issues more carefully and try to do something where there is less chance for error. I don't know the whole answer to it because I definitely believe child support default is a serious problem, but I'm becoming more and more convinced that getting at the drivers license, either professional or nonprofessional, is not going to be the answer because of the seriousness of even a small amount of errors.
