PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Evidentially, I think this person said that it would go through the Clerk of the District Court and just would be a nightmare if this bill would go through and I...I...want your opinion on it.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator, let me...let me, in a moment ask some people who know more about the Douglas County Court, or maybe you would like to ask Senator Lindsay. But under law, they are certainly obligated to have current child support records. They are the same as Lancaster or any other county, and they have them.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Let me...let me...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Now, s. I don't know, I'm not sure quite what the problem is.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Senator Lindsay, may I ask you a question?

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Would Douglas County be able to handle the bill that LB 592, if it became law? Do they have the people and the procedures as far as the computers and so forth to handle this type of bill? The call I had this morning said it would be a nightmare for the county to handle.

SENATOR LINDSAY: I don't know if they, the term "handle", I don't know if...

SENATOR ROBINSON: Well...

SENATOR LINDSAY: ...that, but I do know that they are...they have...their records are only as good as the information they have and there is a lot of information I think that gets in there that people who pay support outside court, directly from one spouse to another, or ex-spouse, people who have died, people who have reached the age of majority, all that kind of stuff, if it never gets into their computer, then their computer cannot be accurate. I don't know that they have a program of
