

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...so I'm sure I understood you.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Would there be an individual initiating this action which could result in the department suspending or revoking a license? Would there be an individual, other than the county attorney or an authorized attorney, who would be involved in this process, that you can think of?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Ah...no, I mean those are really the ones that have the responsibility for proceeding with the action, if that...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: All right, and an error, oh excuse me.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...will be the... yeah.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: An error, if one is made, and I'm not talking about whether it is something done maliciously or inadvertently, I'm just talking about an error which is neutral in terms of characterizing it, one way or the other. An error could be made in the activity undertaken by the county attorney or the authorized attorney prior to the matter winding up in the hands of the department. Is that true?

SENATOR BEUTLER: I'm not sure at what point it is in the hands of the department for example with regard to an authorized attorney. That is a hard...I'm not clear on the answer...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...to that, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. And, I hope you see...I don't mean these to be trick or catch questions...

SENATOR BEUTLER: I understand.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...but just trying to get some things into the record. Senator Beutler, if LB 592 were to be enacted, and if a person's drivers license and professional license were both revoked would that person still be subject to jailing for failure to pay child support?
