

PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...that all of those who play a role in bring us to the point where a person's livelihood can be taken had better do so with great caution. And before I sit down, and I will turn my light on again, I want to point out that those who are concerned and have expressed concern primarily about taking a professional license should understand and realize that for some people, members of the masses, a drivers license is the means by which a living is earned also.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Vrtiska, to speak to the Chambers amendment.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Thank you, Madam President, and members of the body. First of all, I didn't vote on the bill for advancement, I was gone at the particular time and came on the floor when the vote was taken and was not sure, but I did originally support the original bill. In talking to the Chambers' amendment, that we are now on, I have a problem in dealing with that. Originally, I had decided that I would support Witek's amendment. But now it is coming to the place where I have got some real concerns about how much an individual who would have to have a cause of action, how much money he would have to spend in order to get any redress on this issue. The other issue I guess that really bothers me is that the calls that I had over the weekend talking about the errors that had been made, and, I don't know, Senator Beutler, you indicated that it was very remote. It appears to the people who called me it is not very remote. They have had some real problems with some of the errors that have been made as far as being...being...being brought to justice on the...not having paid their child support when in fact they had paid it, probably on about the day that it was due, and as a result it didn't get through the system, so they were charged with something that they were not guilty of. As I said earlier, I had decided at the outset, after I read Senator Witek's amendment, that maybe it is something that I could support. But, in listening to what Senator Wehrbein had to say, and deciding that probably, and this also goes to Senator Chambers' amendment, probably what it is going to do in fact bring a great deal of action and certainly it would be costly to the individual who files that action as well as the state to defend those. So I don't know that I can support, whether I support the amendment or not is not very important
