

records. There is a relationship between the records and what is happening. But, I want to point out again and ask you this, with regard to wage withholding and all that has been going on over the years, have you heard large stories about victimization of those who are paying wage withholding? Or having wages withheld, money withheld from their wages because of mistakes on the record? I think not. The reason is when they look into these cases, and they only look into them upon complaint, generally speaking, that is some poor woman is out there complaining that she hasn't gotten her money, they react to that complaint. They say to the person who hasn't paid, have you not paid, or have you paid? Why would they want to go out and do a bunch of work that doesn't make sense for them? They don't want to react on erroneous information. The first thing they are going to do is to see that the information is correct. And, there are ways of doing that. They do it right now with that whole class of people who earn wages and who are currently subject to the technique of having their wages withheld. Why do we suppose that the same sort of system would not be in place with license revocation whether it is a drivers license or a professional license? Why wouldn't there be the same standard of care? I would encourage you to vote for the Witek amendment. You know I am against it for the three policy reasons that I stated. But, if it makes you feel more comfortable with the whole process, vote for it, because I don't think there are going to be any suits for liability, because I don't think there are going to be any erroneous applications that will go through that entire process.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: There are so many check points, so many notices, so many chances for appeal, so many chances to go to court and correct the situation, it is not going to happen. The Chambers amendment to the Witek amendment probably makes it better. I would encourage you to vote for that and if you are uncomfortable with the situation, vote for the Witek amendment. It doesn't make this a bad bill. Its danger is mostly in the precedent that it sets in other areas. Thank you.
