PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I'm sure that they can. They have done a good job with wage withholding right now based on current records, based on Douglas county's records. Those are the same records that are going to be there for one purpose or another, it works for wage withholding, it can work for these revocation processes. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator. Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Madam President, I would give my time to Senator Chambers.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Hartnett. Madam President, members of the Legislature, Senator Beutler understands what this amendment, which is before us, is designed to do, Senator Bromm does not. But Senator Beutler and Senator Bromm merged in their positions by indicating that I am trying to turn the person who is able to pay child support but will not pay it into a victim. That is not what my amendment deals with. My amendment to Senator Witek's amendment and her underlying amendment deals with those people who are victimized. The only ones who would benefit from her amendment are those whose licenses were unjustly taken. And if Senator Beutler and Senator Bromm, as much as they want to empower the state to trample the rights of citizens, can stand on this floor and tell me that if a person's license is unjustly taken that person is not a victim, then I would say that both of them are speaking contrary to all of the principles they espouse on other occasions. I am opposed to 592 because I am opposed to the drivers license being burdened in the way that this Legislature, president's, and the national Congress are trying to use the drivers license for every purpose other than what is designed for. That is one of the main reasons that I am opposed to 592. I will continue to oppose it. I have spoken strenuously against revoking the drivers license or delaying the obtaining of a drivers license for young people who may commit some offense which old people, such as those on the floor of this Legislature don't like, but which offenses have nothing to do with driving.
