Senator Hudkins, Senator Janssen, the house is under call. Senator Schrock, Senator Vrtiska, would you like to check in. Senator Fisher, Senator Matzke, the house in under call. Senator Matzke, the house is under call. Senator Schrock. All senators have checked in. The question is the adoption of the Chambers amendment to the Witek amendment. All in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. A record vote has been requested. We are voting on the Chambers amendment to the Witek amendment. Have you all voted? Record please.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on page 541 of the Legislative Journal.) 20 ayes, 14 nays, on the amendment, Madam President.

SENATOR CROSBY: The amendment fails. I will raise the call. Mr. Clerk. We are back to Senator Witek's amendment. Senator Chambers, on the Witek amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President and members of the Legislature, I'm speaking now to make it clear what is left before you now. My amendment, which was rejected, would have allowed the cause of action to be taken against a county attorney or an authorized attorney who was involved in the set of circumstances that resulted in a person unjustifiably having his or her license lifted. That was rejected, so now you have before you the amendment Senator Witek offered which is found on, I think, page 535 of the Journal. And her amendment says that the cause of action would be against the department. That still would give the person whose license was unjustly lifted a cause of action. The reason I had offered mine was to place responsibility along the way so that those who are involved in this process will be very careful and cautious about what it is that they do. There have been articles written, I handed one around this morning, which shows, which show the types of errors that have occurred, even though bureaucrats are involved, even though computers are involved. People say about computers, garbage in, garbage out. These computers are not infallible. The people who operate computers are not infallible. Those who pass on information are not infallible. I'd like to ask Senator Jensen a question, Senator Jensen from Omaha.
