SENATOR CROSBY: Time.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...as checks on the system, in my opinion.

SENATOR CROSBY: There are no further lights. Senator Witek, would you like to close on your amendment?

SENATOR WITEK: Can I get a call of the house first and then I'll go ahead close on my amendment.

SENATOR CROSBY: A call of the house.

SENATOR WITEK: Yes.

SENATOR CROSBY: There's a request for a call of the house. Would all senators please record your presence. Would all unexcused senators please return to the...I guess we have to vote first. There's been a request for a call of the house. I'll star. over. Would you...all those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record please.

CLERK: 15 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Madam President.

SENATOR CROSBY: The house is under call. Now, would all unexcused senators please return and record your presence. Those here, would you record your presence. Would all unauthorized personnel please leave the floor, the house is under call. Senator Witek did you want to speak while we're waiting for people?

SENATOR WITEK: Yes, Madam President. I'll just go ahead and close...

SENATOR CROSBY: Alright.

SENATOR WITEK: ...and then we can take a vote at the end of that. I'm trying to expedite time here. One thing I wanted to bring up on this amendment was, I guess there was some talk about the words, in the amendment itself, on suspended erroneously on what was the, what would be the definition for erroneously. Well, if that's a concern, then we better have a concern about the bill itself, because the Section 21 that it amends, that this amenment is adding on to and amending, uses the exact same language. So all we did was mirror the exact
