SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Crosby and members of the Legislature, this is a hard one to deal with also, I suppose, it just depends on how much information you want back from the folks who are charged with operating the program. For myself, I would like to know to what extent the program is, does result in the revocation of licenses. And I'd probably be more amenable to additional information rather than less, but I guess that's a judgement for the Legislature to make. And I think the bill, those good parts of the bill which, which we really need will not be affected by this one way or another, so I would encourage the Legislature to do whatever it thinks best in terms of the information that seem, it thinks appropriate.
