

Schimek, and if she wants to continue this with me, after I've made my comments, she can just let me know.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Just for a minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Schimek, what I would envision is the following, we leave the language in requiring the report. If what I'm offering is added, it will alert the department, the SS Department and Motor Vehicles, that this information relative to erroneously revoked or suspended licenses is what the Legislature wants. So that would let them know that whenever these instances cropped up, they would keep a record of them. And in their report that number would be included. If, as Senator Beutler and some of the ones who support this legislation tell us, there will not be many, if any, instances of that occurring, not much time or effort would be required. But my feeling is that even if a great number occur, there is in that instance an even greater reason for us to be aware of this happening. Did you want to comment further, Senator Schimek, or should I go on?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Not right at the moment, thank you.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Here's a peculiar thing that happens, I draft amendments, I have them copied and passed out on the desk and nobody reads them. The reason I know nobody reads them because people ask me, what is your amendment. Then I have an amendment which in the interest of saving paper, and going by my previous experience, I don't copy and hand out and that's the one that people ask me, what is the language of your amendment, and I'm not able to say, well, it's on your desk, but I am having it copied and handed around. And this that Senator Schimek and I have discussed is all that my amendment would do. I think if this legislation is enacted into law, we should have a report. Whenever a new program, and one which is as drastic as this, as wicked as this, is put in place, we should insist on a report of how it's working, on whom it is impacting, and other things that I would like to see in the report, which I will not go into now because my amendment does not cover all of those things and I may mislead some people in terms of what my amendment does. But I hope you will adopt this little piece that adds to it. The first thing that would have to be done is to not accept Senator Lindsay's language to strike all of Section 25. I understand his frustration. I understand his
