SENATOR CHAMBERS: We have that, we have the clarification...

SPEAKER WITHEM: You have one minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...(interruption) the Clerk bringing it. Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Members of the Legislature, this bill is so important, even though I don't like it I think we need to start working to improve it as much as possible. I was going to work my way through the bill starting with the first page and things similar to what I find on the first page in terms of trying to improve the language, and then I would have gotten probably to the page where Senator Lindsay's amendment exists. But since he brought that amendment at this time, I'm making my comments with reference to it at this time.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Lindsay, on the Chambers amendment.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members. The Chambers amendment is sort of consistent with the point, or it is consistent with the point I've been trying to make. Last week we voted an amendment to this, voted down an amendment to this section which would have increased the amount of information to which the Legislature would have, or which the Legislature would have been provided.
