

on the Chambers amendment.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Withem, members of the Legislature, I don't, I haven't heard any real disagreement with the Chambers amendment, and I certainly don't disagree with it either. I think it would be interesting to know if any licenses are revoked erroneously. And as I understand it, that's all your amendment does, Senator Chambers, is it not? I think that's good information to have and maybe key information to have. If they're not being revoked erroneously, then what's the argument against this bill? And what I would argue is, okay, let's find out. Let's have the bill, let's go through it, let's see what happens, and based on that experience, Senator Chambers, I'm willing to bet that the information is very positive in the sense that there are few, if any, at all, erroneously revoked.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Chambers, there are no other lights on, you're recognized to close on your amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam...Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, Senator Schimek is in my mind. There was something I was going to engage her in a discussion on, but in view of the fact, Senator Schimek, it would have dealt with this particular amendment. There has not been objection expressed to it, but rather support, or at least an acknowledgement that it does no harm. I hope you will adopt it. And this is not the only amending I would want to see done to this section that relates to reporting. I do think if we're going to require a report from these two departments, there is information that would be far more beneficial to us as, far as our legislative duties are concerned, than just this small amount that exists there now. And even with what I'm asking you to adopt, and apparently will be adopted, and I think it should be, we still are just getting some very basic information that tells us nothing about what the thrust of the bill is. So rather than take much more time, I'm going to go ahead and accept a machine vote. But, Mr. Speaker, I think I probably need a call of the house anyway, so I'll ask for it now.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The question before the body is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 12 ayes, 0 nays to place the house under call.
