

So who do you give the power to and who do you allow to enforce the courts orders? You should give that power to the person who issued that. And when she gives that order and says, okay, here's child support for your case, and here's the way it's going to be, you need to give that judge, you need to give her that opportunity to come on and enforce that. And you should give her all the tools that she needs to enforce it. Now quite frankly, I may differ with the Witek amendment because I probably would allow one of the options to be professional licenses. But where I have a real fear is when you're going to empower people who are lawyers hired by the Department of Social Services, and I'll probably make some enemies of those people, but quite frankly in my experience they are ones who don't practice anywhere else, and this is the best place to get a job. And they can become extremely biased in the system. They can also exercise a lot of discretion that isn't wise to exercise, because what they'll be able to do is come out and say, look, the law says take your licenses, you pay or I'm taking your license, and off you go, on to the next case. It's a little bit of jungle law because those authorized attorneys have hundreds of cases, their numbers, they're very difficult. And after a while you get tired of everybody coming in to you saying. I can't pay because of this. And you hear a hundred stories like that. And when your job is to process just those types of cases you become pretty hardened to those special circumstances. I'm uncomfortable with empowering those people the administrative authority to enforce a court order. And so what I'm...I'm going to vote against the Beutler amendment. Quite frankly I think Chris has gone a long way towards trying to put some protections in there and some appeal routes, if you're going to do that system. I think he's written it pretty well. I just philosophically think that the court ought to enforce its own orders, that you ought to give that...don't give that power off to someone else to do. I'm scared about who will exercise that power. It's fine with operators licenses. Unfortunately, I think the only people you pick on there are the ones that have to have an operators license to earn a living, the commercial drivers licenses and the sales people. But in the perfect world I'd give the court the power to take everybody's license as an option, not as a mandate. For that reason I'll vote against the Beutler amendment. If my best alternative at that time is the Witek amendment, I'll adopt that, and if not I probably would not vote for the bill. Thank you, Madam President.
