

PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: There will be people who have 24 votes for something and they will need a 25th one. And, if I seem like I'm willing to accommodate, they will talk to me. I've experienced it here down through the years. Senator Beutler is not the first senator on this floor who got so irritated and agitated at me that he said I'm not going to answer a question. Senator Abboud did it last session. Did you see me lose sleep about it? Did you see me run off the floor and quit or change my approach? Not at all, and I'll venture to say we will get an answer before this discussion is over.

I have noticed here that the payment of that fee is \$95, so there is going to be another fine assessed to this poor guy that has lost his license already. That would seem like a rather, like kind of adding insult to injury. The thing that I was concerned about though is about the CDL. As I read Senator Witek's amendment it appears to me that the court has the main language in it that would allow the court, I believe, to let this person with the CDL license continue to work, if they want to. I don't see that in Senator Beutler's amendment. Now maybe he can point out to me where it is but I have been through it several times and maybe I'm just missing it, but I have problems with the CDL driver. This guy, that is a real professional license too and if we are going to take, if we are going to not take licenses away from medical doctors, lawyers and veterinarians, we probably ought to be looking at not revoking that person's license also. That is the reason I didn't support that amendment, or one of the reasons and if I am going to support this bill I would like to see it in the sort of condition that would take care of those concerns that I have.
