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the drivers license for that purpose, but the approach would be so much better than the one we have before us now and I feel that the majority would be willing to accept that approach. Nothing would be gained by trying to delay it and prevent it from being passed at all. What I have tried to prevent from passing is the hodgepodge that we have before us now. Senator Vrtiska, if those...

PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...who are following would vote on my reconsideration motion, we could eliminate having accepted Senator Beutler's amendment. We could get back to Senator Witek's amendment, which many of us who don't agree on anything else on other issues came together on. Senator Landis, myself, Senator Witek, there you have the Bermuda Triangle. But instead of going into that triangle and being lost, you jump into it and you are found. We have a process that is clean, it is accountable and every issue that can be raised and needs to be raised is raised right in that judge's courtroom, not part of it here with the county attorney, part of it over there with a judge, part of it over here with the Department of Motor Vehicles and the ball could be dropped somewhere and you have got to do it all over again. It would be a clean, neat, effective way to deal with this issue and it would give those say they want to...

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Time. Thank you Senator Chambers. Senator Bernard-Stevens yields his time so Senator Chambers, you may continue.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you Senator Bernard-Stevens as Jimmy Durante says, "Wherever you are." Madam President, members...oh, I see him up front, members of the Legislature, the point I am trying to get to is this. Again if we want to make those people pay child support who are able to pay it, those are the ones I think most of us are looking at. If it can be established that a person lacks the wherewithal to pay, we know that you can't get blood out of a turnip, and I doubt that even a judge would put a bloodless turnip in jail. So, we are going to, and I am too for once, give a judge the benefit of the doubt and say he or she would be fair and just and impose this sanction only on those who are able to pay and refuse.
