CLERK: Senator, I do not have 2889.

CLERK: Okay. So that's what you want to offer as a substitute amendment is 2889?

SENATOR AVERY: Right.

CLERK: Okay.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Is there any objection to withdraw and substitute? Seeing none, it is so ordered.
