

SENATOR AVERY: Yeah, I think that is good and I would hope it would be in that neighborhood. But I have seen situations where we have done things, the state has done things where consultants say, oh, that is good, that is a way to get this. I do approve of a review process and I wanted it. I guess initially I was convinced by Senator Warner that we do have processes in there where we can set up a review process and make sure this is done. There is actually two processes that can be done. We do have the Program Evaluation that has it...a request in already to do a review and then any senator or the committee can create a resolution for an interim study. So, we have those mechanisms but I think it is important and I like the idea of an outside entity, too, looking into this. With that, thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Avery. Senator Bohlke.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Yes, Mr. President, members, as has been indicated by others that support this approach, I just rise to say that I, too, support it and that I was going to speak to the fact that it does add a fiscal note but it has been indicated that it would be a rather small cost in order to ensure that we have a chance to evaluate the strengths and weaknesses that may be there in the pilot project. So with that I say I rise to support the Schimek amendment.
