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person is being used on the information system project but they are working very hard to make sure that all the reviews get done and the courts...they are also trying to help the court up the numbers of their reviews so I don't think that Social Services should be characterized as not caring about these reviews, they care very much. Secondly, the reason I am getting up in support of the Hillman amendment is because we have, we have some problems elsewhere. We have a bill on this floor, for instance, that would move an independent agency under the Governor's jurisdiction. And, that one is a tough one for me because I think that agency, which has to maybe pass judgment on cases involving a lot of agencies, really shouldn't be under the Governor, really should be an independent entity. But here you have an agency which is carrying out some of the basic functions of the state that according to this bill would sort of be out there as a totally independent agency. And at one point in the bill, Senator Avery, the new amendment I should say that becomes the bill, it talks about the fact that the state board becomes fiscally responsible for its own, its own work. In fact, if you will look on page 2, it says that the state board shall be fiscally responsible for any noncompliance sanctions imposed by the federal government. I'm gong to ask Senator Avery about what this means but to my mind it means that this agency can have big fines imposed on it, can be liable to the federal government and yet the state really has no control over it, it is sitting out by itself as an independent agency. I don't believe that the nature of its job requires it to be an independent agency, not like the NEOC or any other agency that I can think of. What...the functions that it would be performing would be...

PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...very, very much a state function. Senator Avery, Senator Avery.

SENATOR AVERY: Yes.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I'm not going to have time to ask you this question now, but I would like a response at some point about what this sentence means, "That the board shall be fiscally responsible for any noncompliance sanctions imposed by the federal government."
