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have two agencies in the long run and surely at some point we can reach that point where there is a practice in place that would make it unnecessary to do so. But I would be opposed to making that change at this point.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Warner. Senator Avery.

SENATOR AVERY: Thank you. I am going to call the question.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The question before the body is, shall debate now cease? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay, at least I assume that is what all the hands are up for, I missed the... Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 2 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The debate is now ceased. Senator Hillman, you are recognized to close on your amendment.

SENATOR HILLMAN: Yes, thank you, Mr. Speaker. First I think I need to address some remarks made by Senator Crosby. And Senator Crosby, I do object to the remarks that you made earlier about this particular amendment came straight from the Rotunda and straight from the Governor's Office. I have not been in the Rotunda this morning. I have not talked to the Governor about this issue, nor the Lieutenant Governor, now or any other day. I have not talked to an employee or the head of DSS on this issue. I attended the study that was done on duplication. I visited with staff in the Legislative Research Office and from the Fiscal Office in that study on what I felt was some timely information as to what we should do in the future about duplication of services and how it should go. I am really offended that you would accuse me of carrying a bill for the Governor. If I carry a bill for the Governor, you will know it. If I am carrying a bill for the Department of Roads, I will tell you. If it is from Game and Parks, I will tell you. This is my idea. It is something that I feel very strongly about because I feel we are creating a bureaucracy. You talk about a bureaucracy, we are creating one. We are not going to get any more from a random review from the Foster Care Review Board, I feel than you will from them doing the total reviews. That is why I object to this bill, and if we are going to have them doing the total reviews, then, yes, I think, I don't care what anybody else thinks, I think it should be under as a code
