stabilization, receding and vegetative plantings, aeration and construction of islands and breakwater jetties to protect coves from waves and provide fishing access. With respect to streams, they could be improved through bank stabilization and the addition of structures that would diversify habitat creating riffles and runs and pools. These are some of the things that the fishermen mentioned needed to be done to these different lakes and different rivers in the state. So I think that's what we're, those are the kinds of activities we're talking about with this money. Finally, Senator Hillman, I wanted to address one question to you,...

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Hillman.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ..just to get a statement of intent from the introducer on the amendment. You have limited the amendment so that acquisition is simply not a possibility as far as this new fund is concerned and this money is concerned. And it's limited to existing aquatic, aquatic habitat. And I just wanted to be sure my understanding was correct in that that limitation to existing aquatic habitat is a limitation to the inventory that may exist at any particular point in time. That is, if in the future with foundation funds or a gift from a private donor another small pond or another habitat is acquired, I assume that these funds eventually could be used to maintain that particular pond or addition to the system or inventory also, could they not?

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR HILLMAN: It's my understanding that that's the case. It's just that this particular fund could not be used to acquire new. Now there is some federal funds that Game and Parks and other things it might want to do to acquire new lakes or ponds, but...and I'm sure they would go into the whole system then and so maintenance would be something that they could do. And, again, I would say that the plan has to be approved by the Appropriations Committee and the Natural Resources Committee, and at that time some of the, you know, if you have particular sites that you have concerns or programs, that that could be addressed at those committee hearings also.
