we will have made a decision here today, or when the bill passes, that this shall happen. So it will be there. What would then happen is after the review came in, if there was a problem, then there would have to be legislation introduced that would either stop it or amend it, and at that point then, dependant upon the nature of the bill, there would then have to be an adjustment to the base of foster care review. But the way this legislation with this amendment would be, treat the appropriations process is that it would have to be plugged in as a thing that, because it would say it will go in on January of '98.

SENATOR HILLMAN: Okay, thank you. So, just to make sure I have this correct, basically then, Foster Care Review Board would come in with their next budget looking at what they would do with the first year with the pilot projects. But then they would come in with a 'udget of a full statewide type project and they would have the budget that would accommodate those needs. Then if we did anything where we decided it didn't work out well, then we would just remove that from the budget, is that correct?

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: That's correct. Foster Care would have to assume that they were going to go statewide, would have to come up with a plan accordingly. If we decided to make a change, then we would make that change as a Legislature and they would, again, have to adjust accordingly to the Legislature's demands.

SENATOR HILLMAN: Okay, thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Waive off.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Avery, to close on your amendment.
