SENATOR AVERY: Right.

SPEAKER WITHEM: It is withdrawn.

ASSISTANT CLERK: And the final amendment is from Senator Bernard-Stevens and Day, and I have note to withdraw that, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Bernard-Stevens, it is withdrawn. Anything further on the bill?

ASSISTANT CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Maurstad.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Do you want me to advance this?

SPEAKER WITHEM: You're recognized to make a motion for the advancement of the bill.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: I move to advance LB 642 to E & R for engrossment.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Schimek, this is a debatable motion. Your light is on.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Mr. President and members of the body. Senator Avery, my staff has just been out in the Rotunda and, as far as I can tell, there are some minute kinds of reviews that go on that are done by the three agencies that I mentioned. And they're not, maybe, reviews in the sense that, that Social Services now does reviews, but they are kind of reviews like how are, you know, a look at how the kids are doing in school, those kinds of things. I just, I want to know if that does not preclude those three agencies that I mentioned earlier from still doing reviews. But they're not the six-month case reviews in the terms that we're talking about here.

SENATOR AVERY: That's right, because the reviews we're pertaining to are the ones that are in federal law and have been mandated by the Legislature.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay, I think that clarifies that then. And
