

same concern that Senator Wehrbein did, and when I looked at that amount that Lancaster County advises that it would be...it would be billed less for 221,000 out of the total of approximately 229,000 estimated cost to the state, something doesn't ring right with me, and I would be really interested in knowing, for instance, what Douglas County would estimate that it would save under this bill. I mean there's 92 other counties. Lancaster and Douglas, of course, probably are going to have the lion's share here, and I think because we are the capital city, we also get cases sometimes that normally would be tried in other cities. But, still, that...I can't imagine that they wouldn't have as much savings as we would, Douglas County wouldn't have as much savings as we would, and if you'd like to respond.

SENATOR HUDKINS: Well, as you know, I, obviously, had nothing to do with that...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Right.

SENATOR HUDKINS: ...figure,...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Right.

SENATOR HUDKINS: ...but if you look at the examples that we...I didn't give examples, but you look at some of the patients that we are discussing, the gentleman who went on a shooting rampage just across the street from the Capitol, he is Lancaster County. Moderow, I am not sure where he is from, but there has been, you know, quite a few instances that have just unfortunately happened in Lancaster County, but I don't know what Douglas County would be looking at.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Right, and I...I don't want you to think that...I mean, I am going to vote to move this bill on General File.
