PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Hudkins. Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Thank you, Madam President, members of the body. Senator Kristensen, would you respond to a couple questions, please?

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Kristensen.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR WILL: Senator Kristensen, on...I just...we came onto this bill rather quickly. I thought we were going to spend the morning on the PSC bill. But just for my understanding, are we dealing with the green copy of the bill, no committee amendments? Is that correct?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: That's correct.

SENATOR WILL: On page 11 of the green copy there's a change made in line 18 to existing law that I'm not sure I understand. Could you explain that to me, please.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Okay, Senator Will. This is dealing in the area, and I'm going to...this is the ALR system where we've taken out...that's part of the intent language that we're taking out and to deter others. All we're doing is informing them, through ALR, of what that offense is, and that there could be a separate crime. So what this is, is basically a...to me it's a sort of surplus language at this point in time.

SENATOR WILL: Is this...is this a cosmetic change, in essence, or is it substantive?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Well, it's intent language, basically, Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Okay. On pages 14 and actually pages 13 and 14, you're striking the words "and the rights of the arrested person". What is the impact of that? And again, I was not on the floor for your opening. If you addressed that, I'm sorry.
