

County alone, are arrested for. And as we are making changes, I want to be perfectly clear for the record as to what those changes are and what the impacts of them might be. I may well have additional comments later on.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Will. Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I'd like to call the questions, Madam Speaker.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Do I see five hands? I see five hands. The question before you is, shall debate cease? All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Debate ceases. The Chair recognizes Senator Kristensen to close.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Madam President, members of the Legislature. Again, I want to express my appreciation to the committee and that group, ad hoc group of county attorneys and other people and support groups who were instrumental, through the summer and fall, of developing and studying this idea and this issue, because there are a lot of other issues out there. This is so fundamental towards enforcing drunk driving laws that I think they all drew together. And I do want to express my appreciation to Senator Crosby for prioritizing this. As a matter of laying some further groundwork, and for Senator Will's purposes, when I talk to you about the notice of revocation that's given, that's what is given from the officer at the time of arrest. When they take your permanent operator's license and give you the temporary one, they give you a notice of advi... or the notice of revocation that has on the procedural items. That's the notice that you and I were discussing. The other is that I want to make sure that there may be other advisements or other things put on the advisement form, but that the Legislature's clear intent, at least for my purpose, and I think it's accurate, that we want to make sure the statutory requirement is the advisement of a refusal will result in a possible conviction or crime being charged which is a separate offense for refusal, period. Obviously the intent of LB 939 is also to overturn the case and to supersede State v. Smith. It's our intent of the Legislature to do so. And I would hope that
