If the idea seems to be rejected out-of-hand by the Legislature, then it will not be taken seriously by anybody. If the amendment is not adopted, it is not one of those situations where I will feel any...I will not feel anything because I know it's not going to be adopted, but it does fall within the realm of what we're discussing under LR 41CA. I am not going to ask for a roll call vote, or any kind of vote that will delay us, but I hope you will either vote yes, if you are for the amendment, or not voting, even if you're against it, so that there will not be the appearance that the Legislature is rejecting the idea that we ought to consider removing some of these others from reference by the constitution. If I'm the only yes vote, and nobody else votes, I am not going to ask for a roll call vote. I am not going to ask for anything. It will be rejected still, even though there is not a no vote.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That's what I offer you, and I conclude my close. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. The question before you is the adoption of the Chambers amendment to LR 41CA. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Please record.

CLERK: 10 ayes, 10 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of Senator Chambers' amendment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Chambers amendment fails. Return now to a discussion of LR 41CA. Senator Schimek, your light is next. Senator Pirsch.
