SENATOR HILLMAN: Do you know in South Dakota there's one site, other than the tribal casinos, which is Deadwood. Do you know, is it in their constitution that Deadwood is the only site in South Dakota that can have casino gambling?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yes, what you call casino gambling. They do have video gambling, which is almost like casino gambling. It does...you know, puts money out but it's not...they're not called slot machines, they're called video machines.

SENATOR HILLMAN: But in their constitution they regulate the one site.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: That's right.

SENATOR HILLMAN: Do they also regulate, in their constitution, the amount that can be bet?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yes.

SENATOR HILLMAN: Did they have a recent election in South Dakota to raise that, do you know? I understand Kevin Costner was going to come in and build a huge casino, he did build one, but he was going to build a bigger one, if they would up the amount that was bet. And do you know? Are you acquainted with that?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Yeah, and I don't think that they were going to raise it, I think over \$5 or...and they didn't raise it.
