Who...where will the ideas come from for all this expanded gambling necessarily?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Well, it would come from this body. Only what this body would actually approve could the commission regulate. They can't go out and say that we're going to put slot machines in every bar out there if the Legislature does not give them the authority to do it.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay. Well, you're talking about, say, ten casinos, right? I mean it's going to be...

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: That was just a figure that I said the ideal is what we were told.
