SENATOR WILL: And we could at that point perhaps focus the debate when we would return on the specifics of this amendment and, hopefully, come to a point where we can progress through these amendments in an orderly fashion and...

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: I would like to get to the point where we are voting on whether or not we are going to let the people vote and not all these other issues that we've debated this morning.

SENATOR WILL: And, hopefully, we can allay some of the concerns or craft amendments that would address those concerns between now and then.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Be glad to help.

SENATOR WILL: So at that time we would have something before us after consulting with these individuals, and anyone in this...

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR WILL: ...body that would want to...that would want to work with us, and have something before us that, at least, would be in working shape that we could vote on, and...

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Be glad to.
