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rhetoric and debate we have on the floor here it might even be great. But with all due respect, you're a man of words, and so are some others, and I'm not. I threatened some people, I want to apologize, that I would do what Ernie did, but I can't. You know I had ten minutes to open up on my amendment, and hell, Ernie, I only went six and a half minutes and I ran out of things to say that made any sense. (Laugh.) Now, you can say things that make sense and keep on talking until you think of something to say, but some of us can't do that, you know, unfortunately. (Laughter.) Or fortunately, depending on what the case might be. But as far as I'm concerned this is all kind of silly again. Give people the right to vote. You know I'd offer an amendment if I thought it would go that would open it up to everything and everybody on the ballot, that's what we ought to have. I'm sure some of you aren't afraid of what happened in Oregon, you know, and that you're using that as an excuse to vote against that. I hate to mention that, but that's...could possibly, somebody won by 48, 47 percent, and they credited that to the fact that 69 percent of the people turned out to vote. So there might be some of you in here that want to control who votes on what. And it's obvious, after I heard the debate on 43CA. So, with that, don't postpone this. Give the people a chance, give the people in the state a chance to vote. Unfortunately, you're not giving them the chance to vote on everything, which they ought to have through this process. So I do not support the indefinite postponement. And in spite of all the mistakes I may have made and revelations that I made to you about Oregon, you'll still support it if you think it's a good idea.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you, Senator Lynch. Senator Maurstad.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: I'd call the question.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Question has been called. Do I see five hands? I do. Question is, shall debate cease? All those in favor vote aye; those opposed vote nay. Senator Maurstad.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Mr. President, why don't we put a call for the house and I'll take call-in votes.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Okay. Question is, shall the house go under call? All those vote aye, opposed nay. Record,
