one. I happen to know the election commissioner from Multnomah County in Oregon, where they've been doing this since 1981, and she's extremely enthusiastic about it. They haven't had fraud problems. They saved money, they've increased their voter turnout. Now, I...I'm going to be the first to tell you this does make me a little nervous when you get into talking about, like they had in Oregon recently, the senate race. That makes me nervous. I'm not willing to try that yet, I'm not ready for that yet. And in spite of the fact that, as Senator Elmer and I were talking about a few minutes ago, we know that eventually the technology, it probably is available even now, where you can be fingerprinted and vote via computer, I mean...and that would be really a good verification process. I'm not...I don't even want to think about that because I think it's really important that we maintain that people go to the polls and vote. I mean that's kind of your patriotic duty, that's kind of gets people's civic pride going. And I think that I don't ever want to abandon the polls. All this bill is asking for is that you can do it in a special election, which people don't turn out for very much because there's not a lot of publicity about it, there's not a lot of advertising about it, there's only usually one issue on the ballot that they go vote on. And so other things get in the way and they don't go do it. We know that if we make it easier for them they will vote and they will vote in greater numbers. I guess, with that, I would just encourage you to vote for advancement. I know that there's...
