And so what we need to do is find a way to stop those individuals from hurting again. So we are offering this bill, the Offender Registry Act, and that will help, I think, alert the public to these individuals and hopefully protect them. But in my view, it isn't adequate. It is a first step toward...the need for additional steps is there. We do not have, for instance, an ability to keep some of these individuals behind bars or in a secure setting for the rest of their lives. And there are individuals who simply are found to be unable to reform themselves, that their sexual violence is such ingrained within their, their psyche, their personality, that no matter how much work is done with these individuals, they simply will strike again. So, in my view, the registry, though it is welcome in alerting the law enforcement and individuals that there is some danger at hand and people need to respond and take precautions, nevertheless, in my view, the real central issue is why do we release these people in the first place if they continue to be a threat to the public? And we can talk about that some more, but I hope that in time, this will not be the answer to the problem,...

SPEAKER WITHEM: One minute.

SENATOR WESELY: ...it will be the first step to dealing with the problem. And again, I rise in support of the bill and in support of the amendment and acknowledge that Senator Chambers has a point when he talks about the term "predator". But I think, I think it's not totally inappropriate, but nevertheless, I would support language that would define these individuals as offenders versus predators. And we can address the other issues in due time. Thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Wesely. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, we're working on an amendment now to deal with that term "predator" and "predatory", but that will then allow me to look at some aspects of the bill itself. And despite the fact that the federal government is mandating this, I don't think a good argument has been presented yet for this. So let me ask a question of...Senator Witek, I'd like to ask you, do you know what the hammer is the federal government is using, if this, a bill such as this is not enacted?
