

between, and have the higher threshold here with the judges, to be able to discern between those, those types of individuals. So I see it more, Senator Chambers, as almost a safeguard for what you're talking about for your concerns, so that not everybody is painted under that one title of a sexually violent offender. So I understand you're going to do this and everything, but I just wanted to let you know how, how I'm thinking what changing these terms is...these terms are almost a safeguard. They discern between an individual who has perpetrated a victim in a sexually violent situation, whether it be an incest situation or a rape situation, and an individual who has, they can establish that that individual has deliberately, more or less, stalked a victim and in a predatory manner, I mean this is, this is why this language is used, in a predatory manner over a period of time just for the purposes of victimization. Because I'm sure that everyone in their mind can understand the differences, and as you get into this legislation, you can understand the differences. So I see it as almost a safeguard because you, because you don't want to have everyone as...and everyone who has committed these crimes is not a predator. But every predator has committed these sexual offenses. So there is a difference and as long...I don't care what terminology that you want to put in here and use, but there still should be the safeguard of, of having these different levels of offenses and understood as, as this carefully did lay out those different levels of offenses in those different situations and gave them different terminology in order to, to almost safeguard those individuals who were in for a sexual offenses. And not, I'm sure there's people on the floor who say, you know, why, why bother, but I understand sensitive, your sensitivity, Senator Chambers, so I would think that you would want to bother to, to make that differentiation in the terminology and have one standard or whatever, and then the differences in the sexual predator. Because we do want these individuals to register upon release for...and these are only convicted. I hope everybody understands that too, these are only convicted sex offenders, people upon...

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR WITEK: ...release from prison. So you do kind of have to go through it and carefully read it. I know a lot of people are for the concept, but if you do have concerns, maybe you'll find that this is really a good way to discern between these
