The question is the adoption of the Chambers amendment to LB 645. All in favor vote aye, opposed no. We're voting on the Chambers amendment. Have you all voted? Record, please.

The amendment that I'm offering would strike lines 13 through 17 related to kidnapping and false imprisonment. There need not, under the language of these statutes defining these offenses, be anything sexual associated with this kidnapping or false imprisonment. By striking it from
