SENATOR CHAMBERS: We have the power in some instances to prevent that from happening. And we prevent it from happening by placing wise, rational acts. So either you should make a general statement that the offense has to be sexual in nature, whatever the offense is, or if you're going to list the offenses, list only those that are sexual in nature. If you list an offense which might be done for a sexual purpose but may not be, don't list that offense because there's nothing in the statute as it's written that says it has to have any sexual content. Write the law, if you insist on it, so that if I knock you on the head, and the purpose in hitting you in the head is to render you unable to defend yourself against sexual depredation by me...
