it won't. But a case dealing with the same issue still remains before the court. I will not object to the bill being withdrawn because if the court would change its mind, then I would have the best of both worlds.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Further discussion? Seeing none, Senator Kristensen, to close.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: My only closing would be if Senator Chambers would object we'd make him come to the hearing and sit through the hearing for the rest of the afternoon, and I'm not sure that the committee is ready for that. So, with that, I would ask the body to allow us to withdraw LB 1307. Thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: You've heard the closing. The question is, shall LB 1307 be withdrawn? All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to withdraw the bill.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Confirmation reports, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Education Committee, Chaired by Senator Bohlke, has a report on page 584.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Bohlke.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Mr. Speaker and members, I present the names to you for members of the Nebraska Special Education Accountability Commission: Daniel Weidner, who is the director of the Alpha School in Omaha; Richard Schoonover, who teaches in the Bellevue Public School System; Doug Ackles, who's a superintendent of the St. Paul schools; and Bob Waite, who is the business administrator in the Norfolk Public Schools and is related to someone who works in some Speaker's office or something here by the name of Michelle. Even considering that, we recommend the approval of these members to the Nebraska Special Education Accountability Commission.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Heard the motion. Any discussion? Seeing none, Senator Bohlke, to close. Closing, I take it, is waived. The question is, shall the Education Committee confirmation report be accepted? All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay.
