SENATOR HILGERT: That's how I read the bill at this point.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Does that make sense to you?

SENATOR HILGERT: It seems that there's a glitch, Senator.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: I think...I...okay, I appreciate that. There is a glitch, not only here, but in other places. Senator Hilgert, if you go to Section...see if I can find it real quick.

SENATOR HILGERT: Four?

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: It will be on page...Section 5,...

SENATOR HILGERT: Section 5.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: ...on page 2 of the bill, Section 5, it says, "The Nebraska State Patrol shall adopt and promulgate rules and regulations to carry out Sections 1 through 4", and 1 through 4 are the certificates and granting of temporary certificates, what have you. Why in the world do you have in your amendment...the bill that you support, a State Patrol setting rules and regs for an education matter?

SENATOR HILGERT: It should be changed to Department of Education.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Ah, so there's probably a glitch here, too, huh?

SENATOR HILGERT: Well, there is two glitches in the committee amendments as (interruption).

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Yeah, and we'll be going on to find some of the other things for you at this point. The point I'm trying to make, members of the body, is you may philosophically, even if you're sad to admit it, agree to a bill. But because you agree with it philosophically does not mean that the bill is written correctly. If the bill is not written correctly, that which you may be trying to do may be thwarted. I'll give you another example. Senator Hilgert, in the committee amendment that you have, if I were a person from out of state and I had a conviction, okay, that popped up...I got a hit on the criminal background check, or I was going to get a hit on criminal
