

SENATOR BOHLKE: No, I don't think it would undue clutter.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay

SENATOR BOHLKE: I think it's...is it usually not in the definition of the crime?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: It might, but you're specifying the things that should be here, so rather than leave that to chance, it might be...because we could easily put it in. And either it would be available, it should be available along with any information relative to the offense. But, again, these are just questions and I'll give you back your time and I'll turn my light on again.

SENATOR BOHLKE: Thank you, Senator Chambers. I was rising in support of the Bernard-Stevens amendment that is before you right now. And I think that if we looked at why it was in there, the question came up before that we had law enforcement doing the rules and regs. In the green copy, in the one version of the bill, law enforcement was doing the screening. And because they were doing the screening in that version, some of the screening they needed to have some of the rules and regs. When the white copy was done, that was changed. Actually, we could almost strike this section, but by putting in the Department of Ed it probably clearly, it's more definitive and I support Bernard-Stevens on the amendment.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Bohlke. Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you, Madam President. Senator Bohlke, I appreciate the support on the amendment. And I'm going to use, I'm going to punch on again on this particular amendment, but I do want to take a little bit of time because I may not get the amount of times that I'll need later on to talk about the issue if the question is called earlier, or what have you. Senator Bohlke, and again, I'm off the amendment now temporarily, the way the bill now is, is that if a fingerprint is gone to, it goes to the FBI, any misdemeanor or felony that the background check hits would come back then to the Commissioner of Education and they would then be able to start either denial or the appeal process, whatever, that whole process starts there, correct?
