We all decided that we're going to sit this afternoon or this evening or whenever and try to work out some language that we could all live together. So since it's been amended, I can't withdraw it, so I'm going to recommend simply that we vote the amendment down, if...unless I can do it by unanimous consent withdrawal, and we move on to the next amendment and, with the agreement that we would work out the language before it gets to Select File and work that out on General File.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So, in other words, I'm to understand that all the work that I was doing to try to get your amendment in some kind of reasonable shape, ignoring the amendments or putting aside the amendments that I want to offer myself, and we got that amendment to your amendment adopted, we're now going to scrap the whole thing? Is that what I'm to understand?

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: I know it's very seldom that you waste time on the floor, Senator Chambers, but that's unfortunately this time what happened.
