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understood by others and it appears to be a waste of time. But if I continue to help people draft their amendments in proper form and they withdraw those amendments or have them voted down, that could be construed as a waste of time, but I didn't realize at the time I was offering this assistance that it would turn out to be a waste of time. But in the interest of trying to get an amendment as serious as this one in the proper form, I think it would...

SENATOR COORDSEN: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...be best to do as Senator Bernard-Stevens is suggesting provided there is an understanding that we will work together to try to get an appropriate amendment. Then I'm not going to resist his attempt to have you vote down his amendment.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Bohlke. Senator Bohlke waives off. Senator Bernard-Stevens. Senator Bernard-Stevens waived off. There are no further lights on. Senator Bernard-Stevens, did you wish to close?

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Yes, I do. Senator Chambers, just so that, I don't want you to go to lunch today feeling depressed that you put a lot of effort into something that didn't happen because we will keep that language that you had, no matter what, in that amendment. It'll stay there no matter what. But, members of the Legislature, I again hope that because of the working relationship Senator Bohlke and I and Senator Chambers and others have, we will work on some language so that we don't take more time because this is an area that obviously needs to be tightened up a little bit. So in order to, Senator Chambers, also, just a little point, the amendment, without my amendment to the amendment to it, would have been voted down anyway, so I'd like to go ahead and say I want it to be voted down, therefore, I decided to have it voted down rather than the body just simply reject it out of hand. So I would urge the body to vote down. I would like to withdraw it but I cannot because it has been amended already. We will keep that amendment, work with Senator Bohlke, and between...before we're done with General File, next time the bill comes up we will have an amendment hopefully that we can all agree upon. So at this point I would urge the body to vote no.
