CLERK: Mr. President, 1141A, on General File. Senator Bernard-Stevens offers it. (Read title.)

SENATOR COORDSEN: Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: I guess this is my day today. Mr. President, this bill is the A bill on 1141 that the Legislature advanced to Select File. This would simply catch the A bill up to the, up to the bill on Select File so we can have a full discussion of both at that point. Would urge its passage.

SENATOR COORDSEN: You've heard the opening. Is there any discussion? Seeing none, closing is waived. The issue before the body is the advancement of 1141A to E & R Initial. If you care to vote, please do so. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of 1141A.

SENATOR COORDSEN: LB 1141A is advanced. Mr. Clerk, legislative resolution.

CLERK: Mr. President, LR 314 offered by Senator Wehrbein. It's found on page 659 of the Journal.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, Mr. President and members, this is a bill that the Legislature...or resolution, actually, that the Legislature has to approve for the University of Nebraska bond. I passed out a summary of that, which is on your desk. If you'd like more detail, there's more detail in the resolution. It's an amount of 3 point...\$3,520,000 to do the four things that you'll see there under the bullets, the residence hall elevator renovations for 1.8 million; residence hall dishwasher replacement, \$570,000; residence hall asbestos removal, \$250,000; and the residence hall computer technology improvements for \$900,000, which is primarily wiring, to have all of the living space on the campus wired for computer technology.
