Commission. And the last thing that needs to be done is approval by the Legislature in order that they may issue the bonds for the financing of this. And so if there's questions I'd be happy to entertain them, otherwise I'd urge your support of this resolution.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. There are no further lights on, did you wish to say anything else?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: No, I just urge your approval so the university may proceed with this bond issuance, thank you.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. The issue before the body is the approval of Legislative Resolution 314. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of LR 314.

SENATOR COORDSEN: The resolution is approved. Confirmation report, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Natural Resources Committee offers a report found on page 693 of the Journal, Mr. President.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Is Senator Beutler here? Who is going to handle the confirmation report for Natural Resources Committee? Is there anyone that's authorized to handle a confirmation report? Senator Beutler is here, thank you.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Coordsen, members of the Legislature, the Natural Resources Committee recommends to you the appointment, the confirmation of the appointment of Tip O'Neill to the Game and Parks Commission. I'm not in the habit of reading anonymous letters with regard to confirmations, but there was one here signed by a fellow named Doc that seemed so serious in nature that I thought it probably should be passed on to members of the Legislature.
