SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: This bill has nothing to do about casinos. This is a vote of the people, it has nothing to do with how many casinos.

SENATOR JENSEN: Okay, and if we do have casinos that would have slot machines, would we also have keno parlors with slot machines?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: That is up to the body next year, that isn't to be decided this year.

SENATOR JENSEN: Okay, in your bill, you have a commission that is set forth to take a look and to really run and control gambling, is that correct?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: I think that if we are going to expand that we should have a commission to control it, rather than to be controlled by the political players of the state.

SENATOR JENSEN: Do you have any idea of how many people that would require to control gambling and to police all of the, whether it be in casinos or keno parlors or lounges or bars or where this will (interrupcion)?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: It's a five member commission, Senator, and I think it would be appointed by the Governor. It would be across the state. It would be, what I would envision would be no more than three from any one party. It would be a nonpolitical appointment. They would serve and run, sort of like Iowa runs their commission in Iowa.

SENATOR JENSEN: But certainly there would be people that would be out in the field examining all the gambling establishments?
