SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: I think there is four. There could be five, but I think four.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Four, okay, so that would...and they are kind of diverse around the state, right?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Mainly in the eastern part of the state.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: What's that?

SENATOR JANSSEN: I mean it's just not for Indians, is that right?

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Oh, no.

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Everybody goes to them, not just Indians.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Well, like I said the other day, I have never been in one so I really don't know. And then I imagine that...that, you know, if we have problems with people who get addicted and so on to that type of gambling, then will...will those Indian casinos, then, put a portion of that money into Gamblers Anonymous and so on...

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...to help us with...

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: No.

SENATOR JANSSEN: ...those problems?
